B. Anniversary Celebration

Mr. Clontz opened up the discussion on having a spring celebration by asking the committee members and four audience members their thoughts on the subject. Much of the discussion centered around the ability to get enough volunteers to help with the celebration and the fact that those that worked at the fall and winter festivals had done a lot of work with very little help. A couple of those in attendance were not going to be available on the proposed April 28th date. Several voiced concerns about the same volunteers working all of the celebrations and getting burned out. Jerry Clontz made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Gary Wilfong seconded the motion. Council members Clontz, Kindley and Wilfong voted yes (3-0).

Items of Business

Item 1: Request from Wendy Griffin, Director of American Legion Riders, American Legion Post 535

Ms. Griffin presented the American Legion Riders request to use Fairview Park for the 2nd Annual Mick Simpson Memorial PTSD Ride Fundraiser event on June 9th. The day will consist of a police escorted motorcycle ride through 3 counties, classic car and motorcycle show, music, food and merchandise vendors. The group will be responsible for parking, setup and cleanup. The group will rent the picnic shelter. This event will be open to anyone that wants to attend; the park would still be open for everyone to come. Ms. Griffin introduced Dennis Helms and Rodger Keziah, Combat Veterans and PTSD Counselors to tell the Council a little about how the PTSD funds are used. The Council discussed the fundraiser and requested that the organization name the Town of Fairview as a certificate holder on their insurance.

Patricia Kindley made a motion to approve the request from American Legion Riders, Post 535 to use the park for the PTSD Ride Fundraiser and add the Town of Fairview as an additional insured on their liability insurance policy. Gary Wilfong seconded the motion. Council members Clontz, Kindley and Wilfong voted yes (3-0).

Item 2: Obtain Quotes for Auditor

Mayor Thomas noted that the company doing the town audit has not completed the audit but should have it ready for the March meeting. The town had a problem with the previous auditor being late also. Mayor Thomas suggested that the town get quotes from other auditors for the coming year. The Council discussed.

Patricia Kindley made a motion to authorize Darrell Baucom, Finance Officer, to get quotes from other auditors to bring back to the Council. Jerry Clontz seconded the motion. Council members Clontz, Kindley and Wilfong voted yes (3-0).

Item 3: Appoint 2 members to Planning and Zoning Board

Mayor Thomas stated that there are 2 positions open on the Planning Board that are currently held by Patricia Kindley and Doug Buchanan. The town received 2 applications for these openings (Kelvin Baucom and Josh Presley). Kelvin Baucom would replace Patricia Kindley as a full member with his term to expire September 2019 and Josh Presley to replace Doug Buchanan as an alternate with term to expire September 2019 (Doug Buchanan has moved up to be a full member on the Board). The Council discussed.

Gary Wilfong made a motion to appoint Kelvin Baucom as a full member and Josh Presley as an alternate to the Planning board with both of their terms to expire September 2019. Patricia Kindley seconded the motion. Council members Clontz, Kindley and Wilfong voted yes (3-0).

Item 4: Update on Fairview Town Offices

Ed Humphries stated that the Fairview Fire Department building plans are progressing therefore our town office will have to relocate. After debating the merits of the house on the Haigler property and the school building, the school building seems to fit better long term. A lease

agreement for the school building is currently being finalized. More details will be available at the retreat. Between now and budget time we will get cost estimates together to discuss at the budget workshop.

Item 5: Festival Update

No update.

Item 6: Park Update

Jerry Clontz reported that the Park & Rec Committee has planned a beautification/cleanup day at the park on April 14th. Piedmont band members will be helping with the cleanup.

Mr. Clontz stated the Park & Rec Committee will discuss and update the mowing contract to be put out for bids.

Mr. Clontz stated that the plans for a spring celebration have been canceled.

Council Comments

Town Clerk

Attorney Joe McCollum stated that he had produced an ordinance for the park incorporating the current park rules. Mayor Thomas requested the ordinance be placed on the March agenda.

Patricia Kindley stated she enjoyed and learned so much from the Essentials of Municipal Government classes she attended in January.

Mayor Thomas stated that he, Patricia Kindley and Gary Wilfong attended the elected officials reception held by the Chamber of Commerce on February 1st and met with several local officials. County Commission Richard Helms agreed to attend our retreat on February 24th and discuss the water needs in Fairview as well as fire fees or fire tax.

Gary Wilfong made a motion to go into closed session to discuss real estate to include Joe McCollum, Darrell Baucom, Ed Humphries, and Teresa Gregorius. Jerry Clontz seconded the motion. Council members Clontz, Kindley and Wilfong voted yes (3-0).

Approve Park Ordinance

TOWN OF FAIRVIEW PARK ORDINANCE

Whereas, the Town of Fairview wishes to establish rules and regulations within the Town owned park to protect the public health, safety and welfare;

NOW THEREFORE be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Fairview as follows:

- Section 1. Hours The Park will be opened every day with hours decided on by the Town Council. No person shall be in the park prior to or after these hours unless authorized by the Town Council.
- Section 2. Regulations The following activities are prohibited in the park unless Specifically authorized by the Fairview Town Council:
 - (a) No smoking;
 - (b) The use, sale, possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages, illegal controlled substances, drugs, or fireworks;
 - (c) The possession, use, open carry or discharge or any type of firearm, air gun, paint ball gun or other weapon. Sworn law enforcement officers are exempt;
 - (d) The use of skateboards;
 - (e) The lighting or use of any fire except in the grills or other places specifically authorized by the Fairview Town Council;
 - (f) Animals owned or controlled unless the animal is on a leash. Animals even on a leash are not permitted in the playground area or other areas where there are people. All animal droppings shall be bagged and put in the designated receptacles;
 - (g) Horses, ponies or petting zoos without a special permit;
 - (h) Hunting or trapping of any animal;
 - (i) Fishing in the pond unless authorized by the Fairview Town Council;
 - (i) Swimming or wading in the pond;
 - (k) The use of bounce houses or inflatable slides or activities unless authorized by the Fairview Town Council;
 - The use or operation of any model airplane, boat, motor vehicle, drone or other motorized model device including radio controlled devices or hot air balloon unless authorized by the Fairview Town Council;
 - (m) The cutting, defacing or injury of any tree, shrub, or park property;
 - (n) The distribution or posting of any material, circulars, or other written material without authorization of the Fairview Town Council.
- Section 3. <u>Picnic Shelter Use:</u>

The Picnic Shelter shall be used in accordance with the rules and

regulations as established by the Park & Rec Committee and approved by the Town Council.

Section 4. Town Liability:

The Town of Fairview is not responsible for any injury or damage to any person, animal or equipment being used in the park. All persons using the park do so at his or her own risk.

Section 5. Rules and Regulations:

All persons shall obey all posted regulations, signs and directions approved by the Fairview Town Council.

Section 6. If any provision of this Ordinance is adjudged invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof not adjudged invalid.

Section 7. Penalty:

Violations of this Ordinance shall constitute a Class 3 misdemeanor pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00 and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court. Each day that the violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its adoption.




